

ACT OF JUNE 27, 1890.
DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S PENSION.

To be executed before a Notary Public, Justice of the Peace, or any officer competent to administer oaths.

State of New York, County of Schoharie, ss:

On this 28th day of December, A. D., one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, personally appeared before me, Frank V. Straub a Notary Public within and for the county and State

aforsaid Lovina Borch, aged 53 years, a resident of the town of Middleburgh, county of Schoharie, State of New York, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that she is the widow

of Stephen Borch, who enlisted under the name of Stephen Borch at Albany N.Y., on the 12th day of September A. D. 1864, in as Private in Co "G" 18th Regt Ill. Cavalry Vols
(Here state rank, company, and regiment, if in Military service, or vessel, if in Navy.)

and served at least ninety days in the late War of the Rebellion, who was HONORABLY DISCHARGED June 2nd 1865 at New Orleans La, and died August 15th 1895
(The cause of death need not be stated.)

That she was married under the name of Lovina Esterbrooks, to said Stephen Borch, on the 24th day of October 1859, by Aaron Sombrogen, at town of Brown Scho Co N.Y. there being no legal barrier to said marriage.
(If there was a former marriage of claimant or her husband, state it here and how dissolved.)

That she has not remarried since the death of the said Stephen Borch

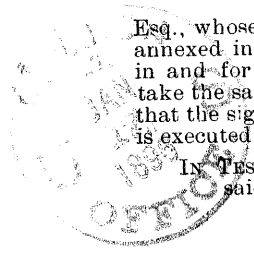

The Act of June 27, 1890, requires, in widow's case:

1. That the soldier served at least NINETY DAYS in the War of the Rebellion and was HONORABLY DISCHARGED.
2. Proof of soldier's death (death cause need not have been due to Army service).
3. That widow is "without other means of support than her daily labor."
4. That widow was married to soldier prior to June 27, 1890, date of the Act.
5. That all pensions under this act commence from date of receipt of application (executed after the passage of act) in Pension Bureau.

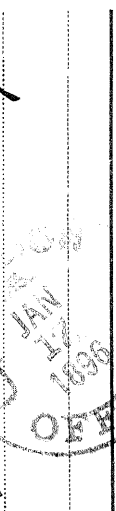
